Institutional Pharmacy Practice Management

The Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Toronto, invites applications for the position of Sessional Clinical Lecturer to coordinate a selective course, **PHM371H1 Institutional Pharmacy Practice Management**, which is scheduled in the winter term of the third year of the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) program. The position is offered from November 30, 2020 until May 31, 2021.

This third-year course builds on the principles taught in PHM215H1 Management: Skills, Communication and Collaboration with specific application to an institutional setting. By means of lectures and case discussions, students will gain the knowledge, skills and attitudes that are required to successfully practice in a hospital environment. A focus of the course will be on critical thinking, problem solving and project management. The course will be taught using a variety of techniques including lectures, case-based learning and group discussions. Due to COVID 19, this will be delivered virtually via the online platform zoom.

The expected enrollment for this course is approximately 150 students. Clinical Instructor support is provided for virtual interactions and assessments.

Applicants should be a licensed pharmacist. Candidates must have experience in a hospital practice setting within the Canadian Health Care system. Hospital pharmacy management/administrative experience is preferred. The successful candidate must demonstrate excellence in teaching, currently practice in, and demonstrate a strong knowledge of the relevant field, and, possess excellent organization and communication skills. Experience in the development and delivery of courses is an asset, including online course delivery. Strong clinical and technological skills are assets.
