Marvin Kopstick Scholarship

The Marvin Kopstick Scholarship was established by colleagues and friends in memory of Marvin Kopstick who passed away suddenly in May 1997. A 1965 graduate of the Faculty of Pharmacy, Mr. Kopstick is remembered for his thoughtfulness, compassion and concern for others. His dedication and high standards of excellence earned him the respect of his colleagues at Shoppers Drug Mart.

Reflective of Mr. Kopstick's extensive involvement in his community, this scholarship will be awarded to up to five students who have demonstrated significant involvement in their community while registered at the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy. This includes (but is not limited to) contributions made, on a volunteer basis, to not-for-profit organizations or associations, educational institutions, long-term care facilities and hospitals, and youth groups. Excluded from consideration is involvement in UPS and/or Class Council activities, and volunteer activities in the pharmacy work place.

Recipients must have achieved at least Second Class Honours (an Annual Grade Point Average of at least 2.70) in each of Years 1, 2 and 3, and Pass standing in all Year 4 courses.

Students enrolled in Year 4 of the Doctor of Pharmacy program who meet the above criteria are invited to apply for a Marvin Kopstick Scholarship. Alternatively, students may nominate a classmate for a scholarship. Please note that in either instance, the application form must be completed by the student being considered for the scholarship (i.e., by the nominee).

Approximate value of the award: 1 @ \$1,000; 1 @ \$750; 3 @ \$500
